Crisp Packet Project 8C

Well done..!!!

8C have been collecting crisp packets for a charity called The Crisp Packet project. They recycle crisp packets and turn them into bivvy bags for homeless people.

The packets are collected washed and cut down one side to make a rectangle. They are then ironed together – no glue, no stitching, just the heat of a hot iron. These rows are then turned into bivvy bags with an additional plastic sleeve added. The foil on the

inside of the bag acts as insulation whilst the plastic keeps the wearer drier. Carefully placed holes allow for the movement of air. The charity also makes bags and luggage out of the packets to sell and support the homeless community.

8C collected more than 500 packets between September and the end of October. We washed them all and cut the bags up. Mrs Clewlow then ironed a whole sheet together to send to the charity completed and ready to be used. 5 rows of 15 packets and the

remaining have been bundled up and posted to the charity to use as they see fit.

An excellent project to get involved with.






