


Hats-off to everyone who participated in 'Wear a Hat Day' today




Library news










Modern Foreign Languages

Y9 Healthy Eating-9CB have been writing about healthy eating in French and talking about different French dishes. They have also learned how to buy fruit and vegetables at a market.







Y9 Healthy Lifestyles -9NW were tasked with describing healthy lifestyles, including doing different sports, going to bed early and eating and drinking healthily.




UNIFORM REMINDER
