A message from The Headteacher

As yet another busy and eventful term nears an end, it is a good opportunity to review and share some of the highlights from this academic year to date. As with each of my previous Christmas newsletters, I have scrolled through our social media to remind us of just some of the excellent opportunities and experiences our students have had and of the superb achievements and contributions they have made. - A range of sporting participation and achievements.
- A range of guest speakers to support curriculum areas.
- A number and range of trips and visits.

- GCSE presentation and awards evening with special guest Martha Lily Thompson.
- Rewards Assemblies.

We are also able to reflect on a successful 2024-25 and first term of 2025-26. Following the previously shared national attendance awards, Barclay's girls' football equal access award and our nomination for a national award with The Attachment Research Community, we have recently received the following additional accolades:

- National School Attendance Award for 2024-25 – Top 25% of ALL Schools in England.
- National School Attendance Award for 2024-25 – Top 25% of SIMILAR Schools in England.
- The highest attendance of all Secondary Schools in Shropshire for 2024-25.
- The Alex Timpson Attachment Research Community Award 2025-26 (to recognise and celebrate the best attachment and trauma aware practice in schools and settings nationally) – nominated.

There's even more good news! Whilst it seems a long time ago that our Year 11 cohort of 2025 received their GCSE results, we are still awaiting the finalised headline data from the government. This is expected in February but I wanted to share that we do know our results show a significant improvement on recent years and that the upward trajectory compares favourably with local and regional data for a number of measures.

In everything they have done, your children have continued to be a credit to themselves and their families throughout this first term of 2025-26. They have consistently displayed our core values of *safe, smart, responsible, kind* and have been rewarded handsomely for doing so. In addition to their personal reward point totals, they continue to contribute towards their House total which are updated weekly on our website our website ([Lakelands Academy](https://www.lakelandsacademy.co.uk)). In addition to these reward points many have also received 'Golden Tickets' (which sees them receive a card to be entered into a prize draw to win an Amazon voucher), 'Subject Commendations' and 'Thank You Friday' postcards as well as Form Tutor, Year Leader and Headteacher awards.

We look forward to awarding our new bronze, silver, gold and platinum rewards badges as students hit the key milestones.

As you are aware the governing body, after stakeholder consultation and the subsequent significant due diligence, formally voted in favour of merging Lakelands Educational Trust with The 3-18 Education multi-academy trust. An application was made to the Department for Education and we have recently received their support for the proposal. A target transfer date has been set for 1st April 2026 with the time between now and then allowing for the required legal work to be undertaken.

At the end of this term we are saying a huge thank you and goodbye to Miss Evans who has done a wonderful job of supporting our students in her role as Pastoral Support Officer. At the same time, we welcome back Mrs Stephens (Pastoral Support Officer) following her maternity leave. Mrs Jarvis will also be joining the team as a part time Pastoral Support Officer in the new year. This week, we have also welcomed back Mrs Davies (Richards) following maternity leave.

Our board of Governors has also seen some change in recent months and we must say a big thank you for the significant contributions of Peter Cartledge, Terry Lowry and Debbie Simmonds who have all now retired from their voluntary roles with Lakelands Academy. I am delighted to welcome our new Governors; Geoff Renwick, Philippa Burrows and Dani Samuel and look forward to working closely with them as we move forwards.

Finally, I would also like to say thank you to all of you who took the time to complete the recent parent/carer voice survey. The responses demonstrate a steady, or in some cases vast, improvement in many key areas when compared to the most recent prior survey and/or the last 'like-for-like' survey in February 2024. Highlights in terms of improved positive responses include:

- 8% increase (from June 2025 survey) in those who strongly agree that school makes its students behave well and an overall increase in agreement of 18% compared to February 2024.

- Increase in parents reporting their child has not been bullied.

- 91% of you say that we make you aware of what your child will learn during the year (increase of 54% compared to February 2024).

- Continued increase in those of you who agree or strongly agree that our communication is effective and timely.

- 22% increase (compared to February 2024) in parents who say that 'My child has SEND, and the school gives them the support they need to succeed.'

- Continued increase in those who say school has high expectations of their child.

- 10% increase (compared to February 2024) in those who feel that the school lets them know how their child is doing.

- 18% decrease (compared to June 2025) who say that lessons do not have a calm, orderly environment which helps their child to learn.

- Increase in parents who report that their child can take part in clubs and activities at school.

As part of our analysis of our parent/carer surveys, we also compare our results to the national Ofsted parent/carer survey data. For the fourth survey in a row (since November 2024), our results compare very favorably. Particularly pleasing this time is the improvement in you reporting that your child is able to take part in clubs and activities at Lakelands. In response to previous survey outcomes, we have worked really hard to listen to your children in On behalf of all the staff and Governors at Lakelands Academy I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your continued support and to wish you all a wonderful Christmas and a peaceful New Year.

Attendance

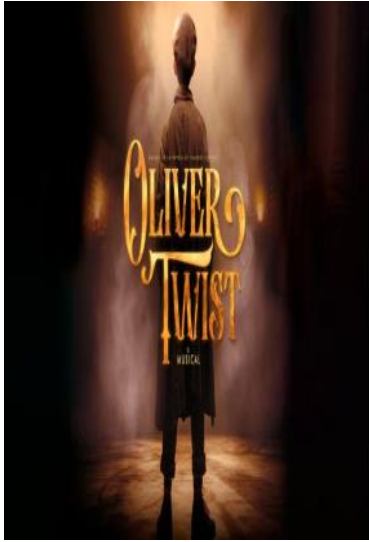
